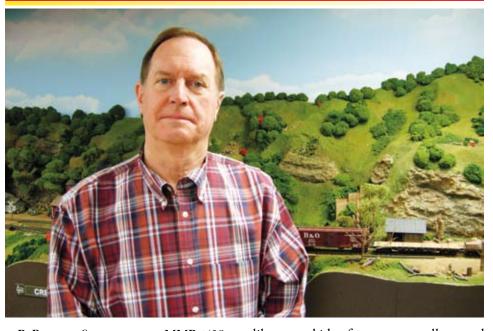

am one of those rare modelers who, while raised on American Flyer in the 1950s

like many kids of my era, actually stayed with the scale throughout the intervening half century! My brother and I had a reasonably sized tinplate Flyer layout. As nice as

the equipment was, even in my early teen and construction of my current layout. I years I improved the appearance by adding extra ties and dulling down the plastic sheen wherever and however I could. I guess the die was cast for me to be an "S" modeler way back then.

After the usual time away for college, marriage, and starting a family, I returned to my love of trains by building a small underthe-tree layout using the American Flyer from my childhood. But reading modeling magazines and seeing photos of some of the great layouts being built in the 1970s, I wanted to build a "real" model railroad. I was introduced to the Buffalo Creek & Gauley, a West Virginia coal-hauling shortline by my brother who lived for a brief time in the town where the coal mine that the BC&G served had been located many years earlier. To make a long story short, I have been collecting information on the BC&G and its parent Elk River Coal & Lumber Company for more than 30 years and have built three "S" layouts depicting it. Each layout has moved farther from my tinplate heritage and closer to a true scale model.

I was fortunate to operate on a several quality layouts as I was beginning the design

not only learned the joys of operations but also got tips on what was needed to build a layout that was as fun to operate as it is to look at. I now find one of the most satisfying aspects of the hobby to be watching a group of fellow modelers bring my BC&G layout to life during an operating session.

In early 2008, with the encouragement of Dan Lewis and Jim Clements, two MMRs who are in the round robin group of which I am a part, I embarked on the NMRA Achievement Program. Encouragement also came from fellow BC&G modeler Phil Bonzon (see MMR earned in the December 2009 issue of SCALE RAILS), whom I came to know through the wonder of the Internet and the website I built to share prototype information on the BC&G, www.buffalocreekandgauley.com. Phil and I pursued the goal of becoming an MMR simultaneously providing encouragement to one another along the way. I'd also like to thank Larry Wolohon, MMR, and Larry Smith, MMR for their support and advice through the

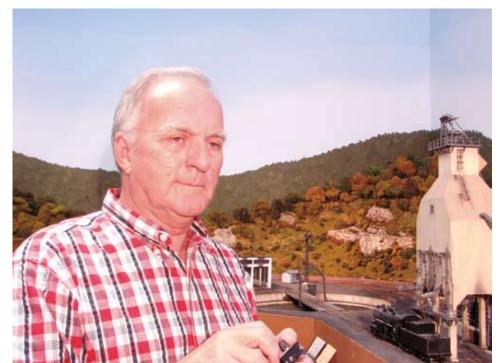

Railroads were pretty much a daily part of my life growing up. My

Wilkes-Barre in northeast Pennsylvania. Located in the Wyoming Valley along the Susquehanna River, Wilkes-Barre was a center for anthracite coal. Coal mines, wife, Kathy, and I were both raised in railroads, churches, and bars were located

everywhere throughout this once-bustling area. Several members of our family worked in the mines or for the railroads which hauled the coal.

I grew up within three blocks of the South Wilkes-Barre mine, which was serviced by Jersey Central and many of our neighbors worked there. The four tracks of the Lehigh Valley and CNJ mainlines passed within two blocks, and there was nearly a constant procession of trains to hear and watch. My grandfather, Davis, was a car inspector for Lehigh Valley at its yard in Wilkes-Barre. I got to ride in one of the yard engines which I never forgot, and rode on the Black Diamond with him. That started my love for the Valley.

I always enjoyed modeling, and my room was filled with models of planes, ships, and cars. By the time I reached high school, I had expanded my 4x8 Lionel layout into an L-shaped moveable layout with a 26-foot branchline that covered most of our attic. Toy Train magazine articles had opened up a different train modeling perspective for me.

After graduating from college, I was commissioned in the Navy. We moved to Norfolk, Virginia, in 1970, and I have
